

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on the Northern side of Highlawn Avenue, near the City of Greenville, being shown as Lot No. 15 on Plat of Property of G. J. Douglass Estate made by C.M. Furman, Jr. in April, 1923, recorded in Plat Book "F" at Page 126, and according to a more recent survey, prepared by C. C. Jones, Engineer, "ay 2", 1954 is described as follows:

BEGINNING at an iron pin in the Northern side of Highland Avenue (formerly Highlawn Avenue), which pin is 368.7 feet West of the intersection of sail Avenue and Hill Street and is the joint front corner of Lots 15 and 16 and running thence with the joint line of said lots N. 10-50 E. 141.3 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 79-10 W. 70 feet to an iron pin, rear corner of Lot 14; thence with line of said lot S. 10-50 W. 141.3 feet to an iron pin in the Northern side of Highland Avenue; thence with said Avenue S. 79-10 E. 70 feet to the point of beginning.
