Welborn as represented by plat thereof made by W. J. Riddle, Surveyor, under date of May 14, 1934, recorded in Plat Bookyr, Page/21, and being the same tract of land conveyed to Mrs. Hattie Cooley by Anna M. Bruce by deed dated Jan. 8, 1920, recorded in Deed Book 63, Page 287; LESS HOWEVER, and excluded from the property shown on the Riddle plat are two lots which have been conveyed away by Hattie Cooley. One of these lots was conveyed to Jas. H.
