County, State of South Carolina

said one and one-half miles West of Greenville County Courthouse, lots 20 and 40 of a subdivision of land known as Morgan Hill, Block 2 which is recorded in Plat Book A, Page 68, P. M. O. Office for Greenville County, said lots adjoin each other and have a frontage of 120 Ft. on Morgan Street and a depth of 200 ft., and lie in the same lots of land conveyed to J. T. Aiken by G. T.
