ALL that piece, parcel or strip of land on the West side of South Hudson Street, lying between the Southern boundary of a street known as Welborn Street, and the Northern boundary of property now owned by J. P. Williamson and M. S. Merritt, being more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point at what is now the corner of the Southwestern intersection of Welborn Street and South Hudson Street and running thence in a Westwardly direction, along the Southern boundary of what is now Welborn Street approximately 261 feet to a corner opposite to and at a right angle with the Northwestern corner of the property now owned by J.
