McNamara, both by Dalton and Neves, dated June, 1954, and August, 1956, respectively, the following courses and distances to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the southwestern side of Broad Street at the corner of property heretofore conveyed by the Grantor to Stephen D. Mitchell and running thence with the Mitchell line, S. 37-40 W. 178.6 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 68-13 E. 162.20 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 31-56 E. 96.6 feet to an iron pin on the southwestern side of Broad Street; thence with the southwestern side of Broad Street, N. 36-14 W. 122.3 feet and N. 49-41 W. 40.6 feet to the beginning corner.
