

## All my undivided one-half interest in and to:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in Greenville Township, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, and being more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point in the East side of Laurens Street at Mrs. Grubb's corner, and running thence with her line S. 70 1/2 E. fifty feet; thence at right angles with the first mentioned line S. 19 1/2 W. twenty-four feet along line of property belonging to the Estate of W.A. Moore, deceased; thence parallel with the first mentioned line N. 70 1/2 W. fifty feet to corner on Laurens Street; thence N. 19 1/2 E. twenty-four feet to the beginning corner, containing 1200 square feet, more or less, together with the right to have and maintain an outside stairway reserved by T.C. Gower in his deed of his half interest in adjoining property to W.A. Moore.

This is the identical property conveyed to J. Lee Greene by deed of The Joint Stock Union, dated April 3, 1914, and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Deed Book 16 at page 358. J. Lee Greene died intestate on or about February 2, 1934 leaving as his heirs at law, his wife, Eva M. Greene, his daughter, Elizabeth Greene Attaway, and his son, Joseph L. Greene (See Apartment 366. File 12, Office of the Judge of Probate for Greenville County, South Carolina). Eva M. Greene died intestate on or about October 8, 1962, leaving as her heirs at law a daughter, Elizabeth Greene Attaway, and a son, Joseph L. Greene (See Apartment 832, File 3, Office of the Judge of Probate for Greenville County, South Carolina).
