8. The general nature of the business for which the corporation is organized is (it is not necessary to set forth in the purposes powers enumerated in Section 2.2) (12—12.2 Supplemental Code 1962) to engage in undertaking, embalming, and directing of funerals of deceased persons, the building and maintenance of a funeral chapel, and the dealing in and selling of vaults and caskets, and all such property, goods, wares, and merchandise as we incidental to and used in the business of undertakers and merticians, and also the buying, owning, holding, selling/letting, leasing, and dealing in and with real and personal property of every kind and nature, and also the owning and operating of motor vehicles and such other modes or vehicles of conveyance for hire, which motor vehicles or other conveyances now or may be used in the ordinary course of the business of undertaking, embalming, and funeral directing.

9. Provisions which the incorporators elect to include in the articles of incorporation are as follows:
