ALL that piece, parcel or lot of land situtate, lying and being in the City of Greenville, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, located on the Northeast side of Webster Street and having, according to a plat of the property of Charles W.Marchbanks, Vance B. Drawdy and Harry A. Chapman, Jr., made by H.C. Clarkson, Jr. on December 17, 1965, the following description:
