Personally appeared before me Monarch H. Hawkins, formerly Monarch Henson, who being first duly sworn makes the following Affidavit and statement regarding the estates of Claude Henson and Clyde Henson:

Claude Henson died intestate in Greenville County on the Sept day of 23, 1951, leaving as his sole heirs at law his wife, Monarch Henson (now Hawkins), and his children Bobby Dean Henson, Sallie Henson Smith, Glenn T. Henson, Lewis J. Henson, (also known as Jackie Lewis Henson), and Hattie Ethel Henson Ross.

That Clyde Henson died intestate in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on the Nov day of 16, 1941, leaving as his sole heirs at law his wife, Elma Henson, (now Elma H. Bonnett), and his children, Fleming Henson, (also known as Flemmy Henson), L. C. Henson, Evelyn Henson Farmer, and Sylvia Henson Farmer.

That the undivided interests of Claude Henson and Clyde Henson in a certain tract of land described in Deed Volume 235, page 321, were divided between the respective heirs at law of the said Claude Henson and Clyde Henson as shown by deeds recorded in Volume 873, page 16, and 871, page 155.
