Secretary of the second

respondents, and the public has no right to the same.

6. Title to such roads lies in the present fee simple owner or owners, of each tract of property through which a given road passes. No such road acts as a property or dividing line between property owned by more than one person. Title to each such abandoned and closed road should revert directly to the present fee owner or owners of land through which it passes.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that:

- 1. Deed Wood Drive, Twin Oak Lane and Elderidge Circle, as described in Deed of Walter S. Griffin, et al, dated November 29, 1960, and recorded in the Office of the RMC of Greenville County, South Carolina, on December 30, 1960 in Deed Book 665 at Page 325 shall be legally and formally closed and abandoned;
- 2. All interests of respondents and the public, if any, in such roads is hereby extinguished;
- 3. Title to such road lies in the present fee simple owner or owners of each tract of property through which a given road passes; and

4. The Register of Mesne Conveyances of Greenville County,
South Carolina, shall record this order, signifying judicial acknowledgment
of the abandonment and closing of such roads, and the title to the same,
and the Register of Mesne Conveyances shall further index this order
in the Book of Deeds for Real Property for such County.
