NOW, THEREFORE, Notice is hereby given to any potential purchaser of the hereinafter described property that said property has been used to manage hazardous waste and that use of said property after closure must never be allowed to disturb the integrity of the final cover, liner(s), or any other components of any containment system, or the function of the facility's monitoring systems, unless the owner or operator can demonstrate to the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control, either in the post-closure plan or by petition, that the disturbance:

- (i) Is necessary to the proposed use of said property, and will not increase the potential hazard to human health or the environment; or
- (ii) Is necessary to reduce a threat to human health or the
