Ms. Kinard testified that from September, 1977 to May, 1978 both ladies taught at the school, but that the defendant gradually began to assume more and more authority over the program. Ms. Kinard said that by June, 1978 she was forced out of the school by the defendant and has not been able to return since, because the defendant changed the locks on the school and had, at one point, the police bar her and other church officials from the premises on the basis of certain purported documents of title the defendant produced for the police. Ms. Kinard also stated that the defendant had no authority to act at any time as Chairman of the Board.

Leroy Williams testified that he is the present Chairman of the General Board of Trustees for the plaintiff church and has been so since his election by the General Council in 1978. He stated that he was Chairman at the time of the 1980 deed and the 1982 deed at issue and that at no time did the defendant have any authority to act as Bishop, Chairman of the Board of Trustees or in regards to subject property. He also stated that during his tenure as Chairman no buying, selling or conveying
