of any property by any church in the movement has been authorized. The balance of Leroy Williams testimony was in substantial collaboration of the prior testimony of Roosevelt Williams.

The deposition of Bishop T. T. Mansell was reviewed by the Court and also substantially colloborates the previous testimony of the plaintiffs' witnesses.

The defendant testified on her own behalf.

No other witnesses were offered by the defendant, though certain exhibits were introduced by her.

She stated that she was the daughter of David S.

Strong, founder of MTPC. She testified that the property at issue was purchased by her father at sometime in the 1940's and that it was meant to pass by inheritance within the Strong family.

It was also her testimony that the title of Bishop was also to pass solely within her family. Ms. Strong testified that she was ordained a Bishop in 1970 by her mother, Lois Stong, and a certain Bishop Harris. Furthermore, she challenged the legitimacy of T. T. Mansell's claim as Presiding Bishop.
