


173 The following Bill of Sale from Reuben Daniel to Reuben
& McKinzy was produced in Open Court & May Term 1792 and
proven by the Oath of Samuel Tarrant and Ordered to
be recorded which was done this 8th day of August 1792.

Know all men by these presents that I Reuben Daniel of
Greenville County S. Carolina have this day bargained sold
& delivered unto Reuben & McKinzy one likely Negro Girl
Named Diniah six years old for & in consideration of five-
teen pounds Sterling Current Money of S. Carolina in hand
paid by the s^d Reuben McKinzy which sale I do well warrant
& will for ever defend against any person or persons laying
any claim, right or Title to the s^d Negroe either by writing
or otherwise as witness my hand & seal this 16th day of April 1792

The Condition of the above Bill of Sale is such that if
the s^d Reuben Daniel doth will & truly pay, unto Reuben
& McKinzy the Just Sum of fifteen pounds Sterling lawful
Money of S. Carolina on or before the fifteenth day of
Nov^r Next En ensuing, then the above Bill of sale to be
Void & if not punctually paid the s^d Negroe to be sold for
the best price that can be got for ready Cash after giving
ten days notice, as witness my hand & seal the day and
year above written Reubⁿ Daniel
