McMillin had stood his Trial as he was there in custody on  
a charge for hog stealing, & settlement took place be-  
tween he & said Bruce & if they could not agree they were  
to choose two men to hear the settlement of their accounts  
to them & that he never heard or had cause to believe that  
said Bruce made use of any threats or unlawful means  
to obtain said horse, but that said McMillin appeared to  
deliver him as a voluntary act & that Sally McMillin  
wife to the aforesaid Daniel was present & consented to  
the aforesaid delivery, sworn to & subscribed before me this  
31<sup>st</sup> day of January 1792
