State of South Carolina, This Indenture made this  
Twenty seventh day of October one thousand seven hundred &  
Eighty Eight between John Winn of Camden District and  
Fairfield County of the one part & Gershom Kelly of ninety six  
District and Greenville County of the other part Witnesseth  
that for & in consideration of the sum of twenty pounds  
of current money of the State aforesaid to him the said  
John Winn in hand paid at and before the sealing & deliver-  
ing of these presents the receipt whereof he doth hereby  
acknowledge him the said John Winn hath bargained &  
sold & by these presents doth bargain & sell unto the said  
Gershom Kelly his Ex<sup>rs</sup> Adm<sup>rs</sup> Assigns all that Tract of  
land containing three hundred acres situate lying &  
being on needy river including the main fork Ninety six  
District Greenville County bounded to the S.E. on lands  
laid out for Minor Winn by the and all other sides vacant  
land at the time of surveying Granted to the said John  
Winn by the States letter patent under the hand of Ben:  
Gerrard the then Governor bearing date the sixteenth day  
of July one thousand seven hundred & Eighty four & hath  
such shape forms & marks as the plat thereof doth to the  
Original Grant annexed together with all singular the  
said Tract of three hundred acres of land lying & being on needy  
river including the main fork of said river the ways with  
water water courses Easements profits commodities advan-  
tages & Emoluments hereditaments and appurtenances
