William Meathew being proven before Larkin Tarrant Esq^r
was produced in Court May Term 1798 and Ordered to be
Sundered which was done this 29th day of May 1798
This Instrument made the 26th day of Nov^r in the year of our
Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety Six and in the
sixteenth year of American Independance between William
Young of the State of South Carolina & Washington District
Pendleton County of the one part & William Meathew Sen^r
of the State aforesaid & County of Greenville of the other part
wheras in His certain Grant bearing date the fifth day of
June one thousand seven hundred Eighty Six from under the
hand of his Excellency William Moultrie Esquire Governor
for the time being did give & Grant unto William Young a Tract
of four hundred & Thirty nine acres of land situate in the District
aforesaid on Saluda river & hath such shape & marks as
appears by a plat to said Grant annexed which plat & Grant
being duly recorded in the Secretarys Office Grant Book N. N.
N. N. page fifteen reference being thereunto had may more
fully appear & Witnesseth that the said William Young for &
in consideration of the sum of one hundred & Twenty
pounds Sterling Money to him the said William Young in hand
well & truly paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
he the said William Young hath Granted bargained & sold & by
these presents doth Grant bargain & sell unto the said William
Meathew his heirs & assigns all that tract of four hundred
& thirty nine acres of land lying on the north side of Saluda
river, beginning on a white Oak on James Claytons Corner thence
along sd line N 46 E 59 50 to a stake thence N 70 W 2 50 to a
red Oak, thence N 20 E 3 50 to a red Oak thence S 40 E 40 to a stake
thence E 12 to a black oak thence S 50 W 25 50 to a post Oak
thence S 20 W 44 to a Black oak thence S 30 W 21 50 to a black
oak thence S 15 W 4 56 to a Maple on S river thence up S river
to S. Claytons Corner & also all trees Woods under woods & other
115 common & commons of pasture ways water Courses profits
