

The following Deed of Conveyance from Joseph Wright to Josiah Foster being proven before George Salmon Esquire was presented in Court May Term 1793 and Ordered to be Recorded which was done this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of June 1793.

This Indenture made this thirtieth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred Ninety Two Between Joseph Wright of Greenville County & State of South Carolina of the one part, & Josiah Foster & James H. Foster of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that for & in consideration of the sum of Twenty pounds to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Joseph Wright hath granted bargained sold & conveyed, & by these presents doth hereby bargain sell & convey to the said Josiah Foster & James H. Foster their heirs heirs & assigns a Tract or parcel of land being a part of a Tract Originally Granted to Daniel Kelly & conveyed from him to said Wright Beginning on Foster's branch on the south side Joining Sarter's line running on said Branch to a conditional line to a poplar tree corner by John Wright's old shop thence by said Conditional line to a second poplar Tree corner, thence on Sarter's line to the beginning to have & to hold the aforesaid land more or less with all the appurtenances thereto belonging by them the said Josiah Foster & James H. Foster, their heirs & assigns for ever & the said Joseph Wright his heirs Ex<sup>ors</sup> and Adm<sup>ors</sup> doth hereby warrant & will for ever defend the aforesaid land from the just claim of himself his heirs & all other demands whatsoever to the said Josiah Foster & James H. Foster their heirs & assigns In Witness whereof the said Joseph Wright hath hereunto set his hand & seal the day and year first above written.
