The following Deed of conveyance from John Hunt to Joseph Benson being proven before Sashin Tarrant Esq. by the oath of William Towns was presented, and Recorded this 11<sup>th</sup> day of June 1794

This Indenture made this 25<sup>th</sup> day of April 1794 between John Hunt of the State of South Carolina and Greenville County of the one part & Joseph Benson of the said State & County aforesaid the other part that the said John Hunt for the consideration of fifty pounds to him in hand paid by the said Joseph Benson the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted and sold unto the said Joseph Benson a certain tract of land situate in Greenville County on a branch of Saluda river it being part of a tract of land Originally Granted to the said John Hunt by his Excellency Charles Pinckney Esquire the 4<sup>th</sup> day of June 1792 Beginning at a stone on the side of the Road thence S 70<sup>th</sup> W by Lemuel Stetons land, thence bounded by Collocks land, Jacob Light's land, John Hunts land & Blasingame's land until it Intersects the road below by Red oak & Stone thence along the road to the beginning containing two hundred acres more or less & the said John Hunt will warrant to him the said Joseph Benson his heirs &c. all that Tract of land within the above mentioned boundaries free and clear from
