

484 The following deed of Conveyance from Lewis Dewall to
John Brasher being proven before In: Alexander Esq: by
the oath of Benj: Dewall was recorded this 23rd day of June 1794.
This Indenture made this seventeenth day of Novem-
ber in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
and ninety two and in the seventeenth year of the In-
dependance of America between Lewis Dewall of the
County of Greenville and State of South Carolina of the
one part and John Brasher of the County & State afores:
of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Lewis Dewall
for and in consideration of the sum of Forty pounds law-
ful Sterling Money to him in hand well and truly paid
by the said John Brasher at and before the sealing and
delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof the said
Lewis Dewall doth hereby acknowledge, and thereof & of
and from every part and parcel thereof do acquit and
discharge the said John Brasher his heirs and assigns
and for divers other good causes and considerations here-
unto moving do grant bargain sell alien enfeof and
confirm unto the said John Brasher his heirs & assigns
for ever one hundred acres of land more or less lying
in Greenville County on the North side of Needy River being
part of a Tract of five hundred and forty acres Originally
granted unto the said Lewis Dewall and signed by his Ex-
cellency William Moultrie the thirty first day of May one
thousand seven hundred and eighty six and by a plat an-
nexed to the said Grant will more fully appear being laid
out unto the said John Brasher as follows, Beginning on
a forked black oak which stands on the bank of the said
Needy River at Dewall's ford and from thence running
up and bounding on the said River to Samuel Piles line from
thence running eastward 62-22 on the said Piles line to a
corner on a Stake from thence running S 25 E to a corner on
a pine from thence running Westward on a Conditional line
made between the said John Brasher and Maner Hudson
down to the beginning Including one hundred acres of land
more or less Together with all and singular the Houses
