

fifty acres situated and lying on both sides of South Carolina River including the place where Samuel Casley now lives witness that the said Samuel Casley for the consideration of the sum of one hundred pounds to him in hand well & truly paid the receipt whereof he has hereby acknowledged he the said Samuel Casley hath granted bargained & sold & by these presents doth grant bargain & sell unto the said Allen Cowen his heirs & assigns a plantation or part of the above mentioned tract of land containing two hundred acres it being more or less beginning at a black on the north side of the land running by an agreed line to a white oak on the south side of the land from thence south East to a red oak, thence North East to a chestnut, thence North West to the beginning & all trees woods & under woods tithes commons an common of pasture ways waters water courses profits commodities advantages hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said tract above mentioned belonging or in any wise appertaining, and the Reversion and Reversions Remainder and Remainders Rents Issues and profits of the said premises and every part & parcel thereof & all the estate right title Interest claim & demand of him the said Samuel Casley of in & to the said tract of two hundred acres & premises and every part thereof to have & hold the said tract of two hundred acres of land and all and singular of the premises above mentioned and every part & parcel thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Allen Cowen his heirs & assigns for ever and the said Samuel Casley for himself this heirs the said tract of two hundred acres of land & premises and every part thereof against him this heirs & assigns whatsoever to the said Allen Cowen his heirs & assigns shall and will warrant & for ever defend by these presents In Witness whereof he the said Samuel Casley hath hereunto set his hand and Affixed his seal the day and year first above written

The following deed of Conveyance from James Brazell to Rich- and Ward being proven before Reuben Barrett Esq. by the oath of Robert Smith was presented & recorded this 8<sup>th</sup> April 1795  
 This Indenture made this 24 day of Feb<sup>r</sup> in the year of our Lord seven hundred & ninety four between Jas<sup>t</sup> Brazell of Greenville & State of South Carolina of the one part & Richard Ward of the County & State aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that for & in consideration of the sum of fifty pounds Sterling to him in hand paid by said Ward before the sealing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby fully acknowledged & that the said Jas<sup>t</sup> Brazell for for himself his heirs Exors<sup>s</sup> Admors<sup>s</sup> & assigns hath bargained and sold
