80 The following Deed of Conveyance from William Floid to Francis Brown being proven before John Alexander Esq^r by the oath of William Brown was presented and Recorded this 30th April 1795 This Indenture made this Twenty eighth day of December in the year of Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety one between William Floid of the County of Greenville State of South Carolina of the one part, and Francis Brown of the State of Georgia of the other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred pounds Sterling Money to the said William Floid in hand paid by the s^d Francis Brown at before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt & payment whereof is hereby acknowledged and therefore doth release acquit and discharge the s^d Francis Brown his heirs Ex^{ts} & Adm^{rs} by these presents the said William Floid hath granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien and confirm unto the said Francis Brown and to his heirs and assigns for ever a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County & State aforesaid on both sides of a branch of Horse Creek beginning at a red oak and runs S 6^o W 204 pole to a white oak thence S 84^o E 71 pole to a stake thence S 6^o W 106 pole to a stake Millicans corner, thence with Millicans line S 84^o E 299 pole to a stake thence N 6^o E 106 pole a Stony, thence S 86^o W 13 pole to a stake thence N 42 pole to a stake at the branch thence S 72^o W 58 pole to a red oak, thence N 45^o W 121 pole to a hewed thence N 47^o E 88 pole to a sower wood, thence to the beginning containing four hundred and Twenty acres be the same more or less it being part of a tract land of 610 acres the same land that the said Floid now lives on and all houses buildings orchards ways waters profits comodities hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises hereby granted or any part thereof belonging or in any wise appertaining and the reversion & reversions remainder and Remainders rents Issues and profits thereof
