The following Deed of Conveyance from William Roe to John
Paden being proven before B Blackwell Esqr. by the oath of
John Harrison was presented & recorded this 21st day of Augt 1795

This 21st day of November in the year of Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety four & in the twenty year of the sovereignty & independence
of the United States of America between William Roe of
Greenville County state of South Carolina of the one part
& John Paden of Greenville County of the other part &c
etc aforesaid witnesseth that for & in consideration of
Fifty five pounds Sterling in hand paid to the S^r. Willi-

am Roe by the S^r. John Paden before the sealing & de-
livery hereof the receipt whereof is hereby ack-
nowledged the aforesaid William Roe hath freely bargained
sold & conveyed unto the before mentioned John Paden
a certain Tract of Land containing one hundred &
one acre situate in Greenville County on a branch
of Reedy River being part of a Tract of Land granted
to Joseph Nation the sixth of February anno domi-
ni one thousand seven hundred eighty six this Exultin-
cy William Moultrie Esqr containing two hundred

thirty one acres butting & bounding on land belonging
to James Cox beginning on a Spanish oak called a
black oak South 30 Ea 96 C. to post oak thence
S 70 E. 30 C. to a hickory thence N 20 E 42 C. to
a Stake on the lower line on the beardam thence
to the beginning with all & singular the woods
waters profits commodities hereditaments & apparte-
nances unto the S^r. John Paden his heirs & assigns forever
