370 The following Deed of Conveyance from William Story to Henry Burrow being proven before Thomas Camp Esq. by the oath of Reuben Carpenter was presented and Recorded this 19th day of April 1797 This Indenter made this Twenty first day of Nov. in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety six between William Story of the State of S. Carolina and Greenville, County of the one part, and Henry Burrow of the said State and County of the other part witnesseth that an in consideration of sum of sixty pounds sterling money in hand paid by the said Henry Burrow the receipt whereof the said William Story doth hereby acknowledge he the said William Story hath bargained and by these presents doth bargain & sell unto the said Beverly Cunneil his heirs and assigns for ever all that plantation or tract of land containing one hundred acres lying & being in the County of Greenville and Little Horse creek adjoining the old Indian boundary the place whereon the said Will^m Story now doth live being part of a tract of land Originally granted to the S. William Story by grant bearing date the fifth day of June one thousand seven hundred and ninety six and recorded in the Secretary's Office in grant Book III and 51st page being thereunto had may more fully appear, and also all the trees lumber trees woods under woods tithes commons commons of pasture ways waters & water courses and appurtenances whatsoever to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining, and also the reversion and reversions, remainder & remainders rents & services of the said premises and every part of parcel thereof and all the estate rights titles Interests or demands whatsoever of him the said Will^m Story of in & to the said premises and every part thereof to have and to hold the said tract of one hundred acres of land and all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Beverly Cunneil his heirs and assigns for ever
