Atton his heirs and assigns for ever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Lemuel T. Atton his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof witness my hand & Seal this first day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven and in the twenty second year of American Independence

17<sup>th</sup> The following Deed of Conveyance from William Russell to Robert Skelton being proven before Robert M. C. Lee Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath of Eliza Smith was presented and Recorded this 8<sup>th</sup> day of September 1797 This Indenture made this thirty first day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety four and in the eighteenth year of the Independence of the United States of America between William Russell of the State of South Carolina in Greenville County of the one part, and Robert Skelton of the County of State aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said William Russell for & in consideration of the sum of forty pounds Sterling money to him in hand well and truly paid by the said Robert Skelton the receipt whereof he the said William Russell doth hereby acknowledge and himself therewith fully satisfied and paid hath granted bargained sold and conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do fully freely clearly and absolutely grant bargain sell convey and confirm unto the said Robert Skelton his heirs and assigns for ever a Tract of land containing one hundred acres more or less lying and being in the County of Greenville & State aforesaid being part of a tract of land granted to William Russell by his son lying between James Taylors and said William Russell beginning on a pine near the Ridge path running down to the mouth of a branch then
