The following deed of Conveyance from Alexander Glen to the Heirs of  
 Forrest Hudson du<sup>e</sup> being proven before David Goodlett Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath of  
 James Jewell was presented and recorded this 18<sup>th</sup> September 1797  
 The State of South Carolina, It now all men by these presents that I  
 Alexander Glen of Pendleton County State aforesaid in consideration of  
 fifty pounds to me in hand paid by the heirs of Forrest Hudson du<sup>e</sup> of  
 Greenville County and State aforesaid, have granted bargained sold &  
 by these presents do grant bargain sell and convey to the said Heirs all  
 that Tract of land lying in Greenville County on the branches of Richland  
 Creek waters of Keedy River granted by his Excellency William Moultrie  
 Esq<sup>r</sup> Governor bearing date the 5 day of June 1786 beginning at a black  
 oak running thence N 40° 38' ch<sup>s</sup> to a black oak, thence N 85° 11' 50" ch<sup>s</sup> to a  
 black Jack thence S 5° 11' 44" ch<sup>s</sup> to a black oak, thence N 55° 6' 15" ch<sup>s</sup> to a  
 Norway, thence S 45° 6' 35" ch<sup>s</sup> to a black oak thence N 12° 6' 17" ch<sup>s</sup> 50 lin to a  
 white oak thence to the beginning containing 256 acres more or less, Together  
 with all and singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to  
 the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have  
 and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the  
 said Heirs and their Heirs and assigns for ever and I do hereby bind  
 myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant & for ever  
 defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Heirs of Forrest  
 Hudson to them their heirs and assigns against myself my heirs & against  
 every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any  
 part thereof witness our hands and seals this 10 Day of April one thousand  
 seven hundred and ninety seven and in the Twenty second year of Ameri-  
 cans Independency
