


Brunks Land so that said land may be equally divided into two equal

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The following deed of Conveyance from James Seaborn to William Cox
 being proven before Thomas Edwards Esq. by the oath of Abraham Cox
 was presented and Recorded this 15th January 1798

This Indenture made this _____ day of December in the year of our Lord
 one thousand seven hundred and ninety four and in the eighteenth
 year of the Independance of America between James Seaborn of the
 State of South Carolina and County of Greenville of the one part and
 William Cox of the said State and County of the other part witnesseth
 that the said James Seaborn for and in consideration of the sum of
 one hundred pounds Sterling to him in hand paid by the said William
 Cox at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the re-
 ceipt whereof the said James Seaborn doth hereby acknowledge have
 granted bargain'd sold and confirmed and by these presents doth
 grant bargain sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto him the said Wil-
 liam Cox Junr. his heirs and assigns for ever all that plantation or Tract
 of two hundred and seventy five acres of land more or less being part
 of a Tract of land Originally granted to Paddy Priener and signed by
 his Excellency William Moultrie the first day of May one thousand
 seven hundred and eighty six situate in Greenville County on the
 waters of Grove Creek and Reedy River laid out unto the said Willi-
 am Cox Junr. as follows, Beginning at a R Oak on Jesse Moody's Land
 and running S 70 E 48 chains to an Oak on land laid out for R Moody
 from thence running N 62 E 52 chains on the said Moody's line to a
 small Hickory, from thence running N 70 W to a stake on the afore-
 said Jesse Moody's Land and from thence to the beginning including
 two hundred and seventy five acres of land be the same more or less
 Together with all and singular the houses, out houses ways waters
 paths passages trees fences easements hereditaments and appurtenances
 whatsoever to the said Tract of land so described as above belonging or
 in any wise appertaining and the Reversion and Reversions remainder
