


and Greenville County of the one part and William Cox jun^r of the said State and County of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Morse Doth for and in consideration of the sum of fifty pounds lawfull Sterling money in hand paid by the said William Cox jun^r at and before the Sealing and Delivering of these presents the said thereof is hereby fully acknowledged by the said John Morse Doth Grant Bargain Sell alien Release and Confirm and by these presents doth Grant Bargain Sell alien Release and Confirm unto the said William Cox jun^r him his heirs and assigns forever all that part of a certain tract of Land originally granted to James West for six hundred and forty acres Laying and Being in the County of Greenville and on the Steady fork of Steady River and signed by Governor Maitree on the 6th Day of November 1726 Reference there unto will fully appear all that part of the said tract of Land Excepting two acres given by the parties for the use of the Methodist Commonly known by the Name of Corus meeting house to be Laid out in a square including said meeting house in the center thereof Beginning on a post oak the original corner from thence on the original line N^o 65^o thirty two Chain crossing a creek to a stake corner from thence S^o 25^o a long a line of Marked trees thirty two Chain to a stake corner thence S^o 65^o along a line of Marked trees thirty two Chain to a stake corner on the original line thence N^o 25^o on the Original line to the Beginning containing one hundred and two acres be the same more or less and being now in actual possession of him the said William Cox jun^r together with all and singular the trees ways waters hereditaments Rights members and appurtenances what soever unto the said tract of Land belonging in any wise appertaining the Reversion and Reversions & Remaind and Remainders Rents & Issues profits thereof to have and to hold the aforesaid parcel or tract of Land and premises as above Described with their and every of their appurtenances unto the said William Cox jun^r his heirs and assigns to his and their only proper use and behoof absolutely and forever and lastly the said John Morse Doth Covenant and agree ^{to} with the said William Cox jun^r him his heirs and assigns against the legal claim of any person what soever shall and will warrant and for ever defend as Witness there to the said John Morse Doth here unto set his hand and Seal this Day and year first above Written
