in Greenville County and on Saluda River and signed by Governor
Pinckney on the Second Day of March 1792 Reference there unto
will fully appear all that part of a certain Tract of land begin-
ning at a gum on Saluda River at the original corner from thence
along the original line to a post oak & Station from thence across
along a Conditional line of marsh trees until it intersects
William Alors line to a light wood Stake thence along a bosc
line to a Hecory corner on Saluda River thence down said river to
a gum corner to the first Station containing fifty acres but the same
more or less together with all and singular the trees waters heri-
taments Rights manors and appertinances what so ever
to the said Tract of land and premises hereby Bargained and sold
belonging or in any wise appertaining and the Reversions and
Reversions Remainders Rents Issues and profits
thereof to have and to hold the said parcel of land and premises as a
bove Described with all and Every appertinances unto the said
Solloman Littleton his Heirs and assigns to his and their only
proper use and behing for ever lastly the said James Thompson
doth for him self and his heirs agree to and with the said Solloman
Littleton that the above Described tract or parcel of land unto
the said Solloman Littleton his heirs & assigns against the legal
claims of all persons whatsoever shall and will forever Defend as
Witness thereto the said James Thompson doth hereunto set his hand

The following Deed of Conveyance from Moses Langley to James Lewis
being proven before J. J. Kilgore Esq^r by the oath of William Gor-
ham was presented and Recorded this 24th Day of June 1795

This Indenture Made this First Day of February in the year of
Our Lord one thousand seven hundred & Eighty between Moses Langley
of the one part and James Lewis of the other part and both of the State of
South Carolina Greenville County Witnesgeth that Moses Langley doth
In consideration of the sum of Sixty pounds Lawful money to him in
Hand Recd the Receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath Bargained
& Sold and by these presents doth Bargain sell aline Release & Confirm
unto James Lewis forever all that Tract Plantation or Parcel of Land con-
taining Two Hundred Acres of it being a part of a tract of 412 Acres
Granted to the said Moses Langley by Patent Bearing Date the fourth day
of January 1796 & Recorded in Grant Book C. No 5 page 222 situate in
the State & County aforesaid on the south side of Rockey Creek waters of the
said River beginning on a Red oak corner old marked for John McFetty
& runs in James Goods line N^E 75[°] W^S 31[°] 29 to a Spanish oak 3x nm.
thence on a true line through said original tract N^E 78[°] W^S 44[°] 50 to a
Stake 3x nm. on the original line thence N^E 40[°] E^S 7 chains to a Post
oak 3x nm. thence S^S 25[°] E^N 14[°] 50 to a Stake 3x nm. on Samuel
Kellys line thence on said Kellys line N^E 35[°] E^S 27[°] 50 to a post oak
old marked for anders thence on Sanders line N^E 30[°] E^S 33[°] 50 to a Red oak
thence N^E 66[°] W^S 16 chains to the beginning Red oak corner which
includes the aforesaid 200 Acres of land and the said Moses Langley
doth Covenant agree to & with the said James Lewis that the above
Described 200 Acres of land is free & clear from any manner of incum-
berance whatsoever and that he the said Moses Lang will forever
Warrant and defend the above Described Two Hundred Acres of land
together with all & singular the Appertinences & Incumbrances
Hereditaments Rents Issues and Profits there unto belonging or in any
