The State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that we John Savage & William of the State aforesaid & County of Greenville for consideration of the sum of one hundred pounds to us paid by Isaac Stains of the County & State aforesaid have granted bargained sold & Released & by these presents do grant bargain sell & Release unto the sd. Isaac Stains a certain tract or parcel of Land containing three hundred acres (some more or less) lying on the north side of Enoree River beginning on a white oak on the north side of Enoree River Running from thence south to a poplar on the long branch from thence up the S. branch to a black oak thence East to a pine thence North to a post oak thence south to a white oak thence west to a dog wood up sd. River thence down the S. River to the beginning join bare hills Maps & Public Lands together with all & singular the Rights members hereditaments & appertanances to the sd. premises belonging or in any wise Incident or appertaining to have & to hold all & singular the premises before mentioned unto the sd. Isaac Stains his heirs & assigns forever & we do hereby bind our heirs & Executors & administrators to warrant and forever defend all & singular the sd. premises unto the sd. Isaac Stains his heirs & assigns against our heirs & assigns or any other person Lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof witness our hands this 13 day of November 1797 and in the twenty first year of the Independence of the United States of America

39 thirty pounds Sterling to me paid by Thomas Butler of the State & County aforesaid, I the said John Peck have granted Bargained sold & Released and by these presents do grant bargain sell & Release unto, Thomas Butler all that tract or Parcel of Land containing Eighty six Acres of Land it being a part of about of 396 granted to William Mitcherson by Patent bearing Date the first Day of August 1791 and Recorded in Grant Book. 6. No. 5 page 480 Beginning on a Post oak old Marked for sd. tract & New for Voluntary Butler and Runs on the original line N. 70 E. 7 chains to a stake 37 mm. thence through said tract N. 35. W. 13. 25 to a gum 37 mm. then S. E. 2. 9 ch to a gum 37 mm then N. 61 W. 12. 50 to poplar 37 mm. then S. 49 W. 2. 3 ch to a Post oak old for said tract then on the original line S. 10 W. 4. 50 chains to a Post oak 37 mm then S. 80.
