State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents, that I Ezekiel Nash of Abbeville County in the state aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of eighty pounds sterling money to me in hand paid by Sam'l Neigh-lours of the County of Laurens and the aforesaid have granted Bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell release & confirm unto the P: Samuel Neigh-lours all that tract of Land containing one hundred & forty seven acres laid out for Joseph Benson lying on Mountain Creek & Saluda river beginning at a hickory standing the bank of said river & running thence N. 30 E. 25. 110. to a white oak by thence N. 240 W. 116. 110 to an ash by thence S. 255 W. 40. 865

to a hickory & on saluda river thence With said river to the beginning being originally granted to Wm. Benson the said grant is recorded in the secretary office in grant Book A. A. A. & Page 340 together with all and singular the rights member hereditaments & appurtenances to the said Premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining thereto, to have, and to hold, all, & singular, the premises before mentioned unto the D: Samuel Neigh-lours, his heirs, and assigns, forever; and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and Administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the D: Sam'l Neigh-lours his heirs & assigns against myself my heirs and against every other lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this first day of February, one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight, signed, sealed, and delivered

for South Carolina Do know all men by these presents that I William Dandy of the state of South Carolina & Greenville being in consideration of the sum of one hundred & forty dollars Lawful money paid by John Peden of said County aforesaid have granted Bargained Sold and Released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John Peden that part of a tract of Land originally granted to James Floyd and signed by Governor Moultrie on the fourth day of December 1786 Beginning where a line of the original Survey crossed Cabin Branch Being a branch of Reedy River in the County aforesaid thence along said line East 27 chains to a light
