The Following Deed of Conveyance from S<sup>r</sup> George Kirby to James Harrison being proven before John McCroy Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath of William Chase was presented and recorded this 25<sup>th</sup> day of October 1798 State of South Carolina Know all men by these presents that S<sup>r</sup> George Kirby of Penlucy Co<sup>r</sup> Government in consideration of one hundred & Thirty pounds Sterling money term paid by James Harrison of Greenville County the State aforesaid have Granted Bargained Sold and Released and by these presents do Grant bargain sell & release unto the said James Harrison all that tract of land lying & being in the County of Greenville in the State aforesaid on the west side of the Needy River originally granted unto him the S<sup>r</sup> George Kirby on the third day of April 1786 for four hundred acres as by the original
