142. The following deed of Conveyance from William Whaley  
to Edward Nelson being proven before John Thomas Justice  
Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath of John Walker was presented and  
Recorded this 28<sup>th</sup> day of January 1799  
South Carolina Anno Domini by these presents  
the William Whaley late of Greenville County in the  
State aforesaid sold in consideration of the sum of one  
hundred dollars to me in hand well and truly paid by  
Edward Nelson of the state & County aforesaid the receipt  
whereof I do hereby acknowledge unto him by grant  
bargain, sell, alien, release convey & confirm unto the  
said Edward Nelson, all that plantation front on  
part of Land containing two hundred & twenty acres  
situate in Greenville County aforesaid on branches of  
Beaverdam Creek waters of South Sagar River bounded  
by John Sparks and Madworth Matthew Sparks, William  
Savage and Kelley & William Bowlands which said land  
was granted to the said said William Whaley on the 3<sup>d</sup> day  
of April in the year of our Lord 1797 reference being then  
unto had well more fully appear, so that to have and to hold the

McCloskey Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oaths of Henry M. Wood & Larkin Tarrant  
was presented and Recorded this 20<sup>th</sup> day of February 1799

South Carolina, To all to whom these presents shall come  
I Mary Maxwell Greeting — Whereas Robert Maxwell  
late of Greenville County and State aforesaid, did intestate  
on or about the Eighteenth day of November, in the year  
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven  
and who at the time of his death was seized and possessed  
of a personal estate consisting in Negroes, Horses, Cattle, plan-  
tation Tools Household furniture &c leaving four infant  
children (viz) Anne Anderson Maxwell, John Maxwell,  
Elizabeth Maxwell Robert Anderson Maxwell and the said  
Mary Maxwell their undivided mother and —

Whereas Robert Anderson Esquire a citizen of Pendleton  
County in the State aforesaid did join with me the  
said Mary Maxwell who forthwith applied to the  
Honorable the Court of Greenville County for Letters of  
Administration upon which an Inventory & apprais-  
ement of the said Estate was made out on or about the  
twenty second day of June last and a return thereof  
made to the said Court as by law directed. And  
whereas an order of Sale was obtained from the said  
Court and the whole of the personal Estate of the said
