P. O. S<sup>t</sup> running thence on Huttons Land N<sup>o</sup> 40<sup>th</sup> Bg<sup>c</sup> to a stake S<sup>t</sup> P. I. S<sup>t</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> U. L. 5. 5<sup>th</sup> 1/4<sup>th</sup> on land unknown to a S. S<sup>t</sup> P. I. S<sup>t</sup> 2. 5<sup>th</sup> E. 63<sup>rd</sup> 00<sup>th</sup> on William Smythes land to a B. C. B. thence on land formerly Belonging to David Ross S. 2. 0 E. 36<sup>rd</sup> 00<sup>th</sup> to a Red O. B.<sup>t</sup> the same land as mentioned last Decr. Airt 16. 42<sup>nd</sup> the Beginning corner together with all & singular the Rights Members Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises Belonging in anywise Incident or appertaining I have and to hold all and singular the premises Before mentioned unto the said James Gilliland his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the said premises or tract of land unto the said James Gilliland his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs &

The following Deed of Conveyance from David Norrie of Piedmont Norrie to Jonathan Woodde being proven before John Tubb Esq; by the oath of Nathaniel Norrie was presented and Recorded this 26<sup>th</sup> day of March 1799. This Indenture made this Eighth Day of October one thousand Seven hundred & ninety Seven and in the Twenty second Year of the Independency of the United States of America Between David Norrie of the County of Greenville & State of South Carolina of the one part and Jonathan Woodde of said County and State aforesaid of the other part - Witnesseth that the said David Norrie for and in consideration of the sum of forty & five ~~pounds~~ Dollars Current Money of said State in hand paid by the said Jonathan Woodde at and before the sealing of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath Granted Bargained sold and delivered Conveyed and Confirm'd, and by these presents doth Grant Bargain sell Convey and Confirm unto the said Jonathan Woodde his Heirs and assigns for ever certain Tract or parcel of land lying as follows Beginning at the Head of a Branch thence S. 25<sup>th</sup> to a Rock running along side Path to Hickory on same N<sup>o</sup> Sunkins line; thence along he line N<sup>o</sup> 60<sup>th</sup> E to a Red Oak Blazed by David McWay & Isaac Wilkins in order to divide it from a piece sold to Wilkins, thence down the Ridge to the Beginning being fifty acres more or less being part of said Tract or parcel of land granted to Robert Prince on the seventh of March 1786
