




188 The following deed of conveyance from Isaac Preston to  
 William Taylor being proven before Robert M. Affee Esq.  
 by the oath of Isaac Low was presented and Recorded  
 this 26<sup>th</sup> day of April 1799  
 This indenture made the Twelfth day of August in the  
 year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight between  
 Isaac Preston of the State of South Carolina and County  
 of Greenville of the one part and William Taylor of the same  
 County and State of the other part Witnesseth that the said  
 Isaac Preston for and in consideration of the sum of  
 Seven hundred Dollars to him in hand paid by the said  
 William Taylor (the Receipt whereof is here by acknow-  
 ledged) he the said Isaac Preston hath Bargained and  
 sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the  
 said W. T. Taylor certain tract or parcel of Land lying  
 and being in Greenville County on Branches of Enoree  
 River containing by Estimation five hundred acres be-  
 the same more or less it being part of a tract of Land  
 originally Granted to Uriah Corner beginning at  
 public on a branch whereon the old meeting house stands  
 and running a conditional line between the said

189 Preston & Henry Chamble up the South side of said branch  
 to the head of S<sup>d</sup> Branch thence to go a conditional Marked line  
 to a post Oak corner on Cornus Old line thence I go to a  
 post Oak corner thence E. 100 to a Red oak thence S. 3/4  
 N. 50 to a dog wood thence up the Branch to the Beginning  
 which said tract of five Hundred acres be the same more or  
 less with all and Every of its appurtenances the said Isaac  
 Preston doth fear himself and his heirs and from all  
 and Every other person and persons will warrant and  
 forever defend to the said William Taylor his heirs  
 & assigns forever in witness whereof the said Isaac Pre-  
 ston hath hereunto set his hand & affixed his seal the

189 The following deed of conveyance from Nathaniel Sundry  
 to John M. Clare being proven before Wm. J. Brown Esq.  
 by the oath of James Maxwell was presented and  
 Recorded this 26<sup>th</sup> day of April 1799  
 This indenture made this 21<sup>st</sup> day of January and in the year  
 of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety five and  
 in the nineteenth year of the American Independence  
 between Nathaniel Sundry of the County of Greenville and  
 State of South Carolina of the one part and John  
 M. Clare of the same place of the other part Witnesseth  
 that the said Nathaniel Sundry for and in the consid-  
 eration of the sum ten pounds Sterling money to him in  
 hand paid by the said John M. Clare the Receipt whereof  
 he the said Nathaniel Sundry doth acknowledge him-  
 self fully satisfied and paid by these presents hath  
 Given Granted and sold and sold in full of conveyance
