246 The following deed of conveyance from James Brock to John Sammon being given before George Salmon Esq^r by the oath of David Scott was presented and received this 5th day of Jan^y 1799 This Indenture made this second day of January one thousand seven hundred & ninety nine between James Brock of Greenville County & State of Carolina of the one part & John Sammon of the same County & State aforesaid of the other part witness both that the said James Brock for & in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred Dollars to him in hand paid by John Sammon the receipt whereof the said James Brock doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained & sold & by these presents doth Grant bargain sell Deliver & Confirm unto him the said John Sammon his heirs and assigns forever One certain Tract or parcel of Land situate lying & being in the County of Greenville on the waters of Needy river near the Sth side of Pausse's mountain containing one hundred and fifty acres more or less and Bounded as follows (Viz) beginning on a corner on

247 Frederick Rowles line thence west Sammons line to an old pine stump on Samuel Magneses line thence Magneses new line S^o to David Brooks line thence on Brooks line to a corner post back on Walkers Sammons line thence N^o to the Beginning To have & to hold the above said land & premises with all & singular the privileges & appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining to him the said John Sammon his heirs & assigns forever to have hold use occupy possess & enjoy the same with every part or part thereof to him the said John Sammon his heirs and assigns forever against him the said James Brock & his heirs & against the claim & demand of any other person what soever shall do & will forever warrant defend in writing whereof the said James Brock hath hereunto set his hand & affixed his seal the day & year first above written Sign sealed and acknowledged in presence of James Brock Esq^r Test John Staton David Scroggs Edmund ^{his} Staton ^{mark}
