being proven before George Salmen Esq. by the oath of Christopher Brandon  
was presented and recorded this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of July 1799 -

Know all men by these presents that I John Brandon of the County  
of Union and State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum  
of Five hundred Dollars to me paid by James Brandon of the  
State and County aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released  
and by these presents do Grant bargain sell and release unto James  
Brandon certain tract of Land Situate on the middle fork of Saluda  
River Beginning at a Spanish Oak running thence S 32<sup>o</sup> W  
2 1/2 Chains to white Oak thence S 56<sup>o</sup> E to a Hickory thence to a  
Hickory thence to a Hornbeam on the bank of the River thence  
up the river to an ash thence to a Stake thence to a stake thence  
4 5/8 W 66 Chains to the beginning containing one hundred and  
fifty acres together with all and singular the rites members Heri-  
ditaments appertanances to the premises in any wise incident or  
appertaining I have and do hold all and singular the granted premises  
as before mentioned unto the said James Brandon his heirs and assigns  
forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators  
to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises  
unto the said James Brandon his heirs and assigns against my  
self my heirs and against every other person whomsoever lawfully  
claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof as witness my  
hand and seal this tenth Day of December in the year of our Lord  
one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight and in the twenty  
second year of American Independence

303 The following deed of conveyance from Gibson Southern to Martin Ayres  
being proven before David Goodlett Esq. by the oath of Robert McPherson  
was presented and recorded this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of July 1799  
This indenture made this third day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand  
seven hundred and ninety nine Between Gibson Southern of the County  
of Greenville & State of South Carolina of the one part and Martin  
Ayres of the same place of the other part witnesseth that the said  
Gibson Southern for and in consideration of the sum of Sixty five  
Dollars to him in hand paid by the said Martin Ayres (the receipt  
whereof is here by us knowledged) he the said Gibson Southern hath  
bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto  
the said Martin Ayres certain tract or parcel of Land containing one  
hundred acres be the same more fully lying on the East side of Cro-  
ner river in Greenville County Beginning on a post oak some  
distance above the shoal that is above the walnut bottom and running  
up a hollow to a pine thence to a small post oak on the old line thence  
with the old line N 50<sup>o</sup> to a post oak corner thence South 58<sup>o</sup> W to  
28<sup>o</sup> to a pine thence with Bensons old line to the river thence down  
the river the river as it meanders to the beginning which said  
tract of Land of one hundred acres more fully with all and every  
of its appertanances the said Gibson Southern doth from himself  
and his heirs and assigns forever convey & the person or persons will  
warrant and forever defend to the said Martin Ayres his heirs and  
assigns forever in witness whereof the said Gibson Southern hath hereunto  
set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year above written signed  
sealed and delivered in presence of

The following deed of conveyance from John Douthett to Samuel  
Douthett being proven before George Salmen Esq. by the oath of  
John Wilson was presented and recorded this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of July 1799  
State of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina  
This indenture made this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of January one thousand seven  
hundred and ninety nine Between John Douthett of the County of Greenville and  
John Douthett of the State of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina and County of Greenville of the  
one part and Samuel Douthett of the County and State aforesaid  
of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Douthett for and in  
consideration of the sum of One thousand Dollars paid to me in hand by  
the said Samuel Douthett have bargained and sold and by these presents do  
bargain and sell make here and confirm unto the said Samuel  
Douthett his heirs and assigns one certain tract or parcel of Land
