


The following deed of conveyance from Francis Clayton to David Royal Pace being proven before Willey S. Brown Esq. by the death of William Casley was presented and Recorded this 10th day of August 1799


This Indenture made this twenty third day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven between Francis Clayton of Greenville County and State of South Carolina of the one part & Royal Pace of the County and State aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said Francis Clayton for and in consideration of the sum of Ten Pounds Sterling money to him in hand paid by the said Royal Pace the receipt he doth here by acknowledge & himself fully satisfied & by these presents hath given granted Bargained & sold unto him the said Royal Pace Paid of a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid containing One hundred acres be the same more or less to be in part of a tract of five hundred and seventy four acres granted to W^m Clayton by his Excellency William Moultrie by a Grant bearing date one thousand seven hundred and ninety three by him conveyed to James Johnston from John Stone to Moses Clayton from Moses Clayton to Francis Clayton & from Francis Clayton to the said Royal Pace bounded as follows beginning at a white Oak at an angle Corner thence along John Gowens line to his corner and from thence to the top of Maxwells Ridge thence within the Original plat containing One hundred acres be the same more or less together with all & singular the rights & privileges therein unto belonging or in any wise appertaining to the aforesaid land and premises and the said Francis Clayton doth Covenant and agree to and with the s^d Royal Pace that he the said Royal Pace shall & will May for ever here after peacefully & quietly by have hold and enjoy the aforesaid land & premises without molestation of any person or persons what so ever laying any Right title or claim to the same & the said Francis Clayton his heirs Executors & Administrators to him the said Royal Pace his heirs or assigns & the s^d Francis Clayton do warrant and for defend the title of the aforesaid land & premises in witness whereof he heath set his hand and seal the day & year first above written

The following deed of conveyance from John Tubbs to Samuel Duncan being proven before David Goodlette Esq. by the death of Robert Duncan was presented and Recorded this 12th day of August 1799

State of Carolina

Know all men by these presents that John Tubbs of Greenville County and State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred dollars to me paid by Samuel Duncan of the State and County aforesaid have granted bargained sold and Released and by these presents do Grant bargain, sell, and Release, unto the said Samuel Duncan a Tract or parcel of Land containing One hundred and sixty acres be the same more or less Situate in Greenville County on the west side of Brown River being part of a tract of six hundred and odd acres of Land granted to John Savage the third day of April one thousand seven hundred and eighty six and conveyed from John Savage to John Tubbs and Reuss as follows Beginning on a Log wood on the north Bank of Brown thence down the said River to John Savages lower line thence West with said line Twenty seven Chains to a Post Oak Corner thence S 25 degrees west with said line across beaver dam to a Post Oak a Conventional line between Samuel & Joseph Duncan and from that Post Oak Corner along a straight line to the beginning together with all and singular rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Samuel Duncan his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Samuel Duncan his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every other Person whomsoever Lawfully claiming or to Claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand the second day of March one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine
