

The following deed of Conveyance from William Douphel to James  
 Seaborn being proven before Hudson Berry Esq. by the oath of James Seaborn  
 was presented and Recorded this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of September 1799  
 State of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina Greenville County Washington District  
 This Indenture made the eighth day of November one thousand  
 seven hundred and ninety seven Between William Douphel of the  
 County of Chester and state aforesaid planter of the one part and James  
 Seaborn of Greenville County and state aforesaid planter of the  
 other part Witnesseth that the said William Douphel for and in  
 consideration of the sum of Twenty five pounds Sterling money to him  
 in hand paid at and before the sealing & delivering of these presents  
 by the said James Seaborn the Receipt whereof is here by acknowledged  
 hath Granted bargained and sold by these presents do grant bar-  
 gain & sell to him the said James Seaborn All that Tract or parcel of  
 Land Containing Three hundred and Twenty acres for the same more or less  
 situate as per Grant once small branch Eastward of the Golden Grove  
 it being the one half of a tract of six hundred and forty acres granted  
 to Alexander Johnson by his Excellency Benjamin Guardo then  
 Governor of the State aforesaid the other half being sold and conveyed  
 to William Cotton by and bearing date the day of date of these presents  
 each of them to wit the said James Seaborn to share and share alike as to  
 the quantity contained in the above said tract of six hundred and forty acres  
 a reservation of Five acres to be laid off in a square  
 so as to include a meeting house built by the members of the  
 new hope society and to include a spring contiguous thereto which he  
 has conveyed for the use of the society by a memorandum bearing date the  
 day next before the day of the date of these presents which tract of  
 three hundred and twenty acres (more or less) as aforesaid with all the  
 appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining  
 to the said Three hundred and Twenty acres (more or less) to be laid off  
 between the said James Seaborn and the said William Cotton by a line  
 running the whole tract into two equal parts each to share and share  
 alike alike in the quantity aforesaid allowing the aforesaid Reservation  
 of five acres for the use of the new hope society to be laid off as aforesaid  
 Giving and Granting to the said James Seaborn and his heirs for-  
 ever to the said Three hundred and twenty acres (more or less) it being  
 the west part of the aforesaid whole Tract all my Right title claim

and Interest whatsoever to the said James Seaborn his Heirs & assigns  
 absolute by & from Reference being had to the original plat & Grant now  
 in the hands of the said James Seaborn will make more fully and at large  
 appear to have and to hold to the above mentioned tract of Land containing  
 Three hundred and twenty acres (more or less) as aforesaid to the said  
 James Seaborn and his heirs absolutely and forever and lastly  
 the said William Douphel for himself his Heirs and assigns and from  
 all persons claiming or to Claim unto them or any of them and also  
 from all any body other person or persons what so ever will warrant  
 and defend the above mentioned tract of Land & bargain premises with  
 all the appurtenances therunto belonging Containing three hundred and  
 twenty acres as aforesaid (allowing as aforesaid) to the said James Seaborn  
 and his heirs forever In witness whereof the said William Douphel doth here-  
 unto set his hand & seal the day and year first above written

The following deed of Conveyance from William Austin to Solomon  
 Bolton being proven before Natalia Griffin Esq. by the oath of James  
 Richardson was presented and Recorded this 4<sup>th</sup> day of September 1796  
 State of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina Greenville County  
 This Indenture made this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of Au-  
 gust 1795 Between William Austin of the County of Greenville and  
 state aforesaid of the one part and Solomon Bolton of the County and  
 state aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said William  
 Austin for and in consideration of the sum of fifteen pound Sterling  
 to him in hand paid by the said Solomon Bolton at and before the  
 sealing and delivering of these presents the Receipt of which the said  
 William Austin doth acknowledge and that and of and from Every part  
 and parcel thereof doth acquit and discharge the said Solomon Bolton  
 his heirs and assigns and for all other good Causes and consideration  
 hereunto moving have Granted Bargained sold aliened in proper and  
 confirmed and by these presents doth Grant Bargain sell alien in fee and  
 confirmed unto the said Solomon Bolton his Heirs and assigns an  
 part of a certain tract of Land containing five hundred and twenty  
 acres Originally Granted to Abraham Markland signified by his
