




362 Baylis Carle reposing special Trust and Confidence in Jeremiah Stokes have constituted and appointed & by these presents do make & appoint him the said (Jeremiah Stokes) my true and lawfull attorney for me and in my name & stead to bargain sell & deliver and convey under his hand and seal to such persons or persons as the said Jeremiah Stokes shall think proper on such terms as he shall think fit all my right title properly Interest & Claim of in and to a certain Plantation or Tract of Land situate lying & being on Derow Creek a branch of the Oconee River in the state of Georgia Granting and Giving unto my said attorney by these presents my full & whole power strength and authority in & about the said premises as fully & largely to all intents & purposes as I might or could do were I personally present in and the matter required more special authority than is herein given certifying & allowing & holding for firm & effectual all and what so ever my said attorney shall lawfully do in and about the said premises by virtue hereof In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 17<sup>th</sup> day of October in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine and in the Twenty fourth year of the sovereignty & Independence of the United States of America

362 The following Deed of Conveyance from George Flanagan to James Gilbert being proved before James Gilgou Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath of James Halk was presented and recorded this 11<sup>th</sup> day of November 1799 This Indenture made this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of April 1799 between George Flanagan of the State of South Carolina & Greenville County of the one part & James Gilbert of Laurens County & State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said George Flanagan for an in consideration of the sum of one Hundred pound Sterling to him in hand paid the Receipt is here by acknowledged the said George Flanagan doth bargain sell & convey unto the said James Gilbert a certain of Land lying and being and in the State aforesaid in the County of Greenville on the S<sup>th</sup> side of Derow Creek the waters of Oconee River conveyed from Benjamin Nancy to Nicholas White an from S<sup>th</sup> White to George Flanagan from S<sup>th</sup> Flanagan to James Gilbert recorded in Greenville County recorded in Book D page 207 & 209 Beginning on a Sassafras Conditional Corner Running from Forks Lane to a post oak corner then West to Corner on a Post

363 Oak North a Cross Creek to where S<sup>th</sup> Fine crosses the branch that Thomas Nations now lives on, thence Down S<sup>th</sup> Branch to S<sup>th</sup> Creek thence down S<sup>th</sup> Creek to the Shore together with a sufficient Quantity of Ground for a Log and Lumber Yard and all the Land that S<sup>th</sup> Gilbert shall Drown & run flow shall be put from S<sup>th</sup> Flanagan his heirs in Ejecting all the tract to Person Thence down S<sup>th</sup> Creek the Course of Creek to the beginning Sealed to include an hundred Acres more. L<sup>th</sup> with all its appertinances then unto belonging or in any wise appertaining and also the Reversion Reservations Remainders and Remainders Rents Profits & Issues there of unto the only proper and absolute and behoof of him the said James Gilbert his heirs & assigns and he the said James Gilbert his heirs & assigns shall and may from time to time and at all times hereafter have hold use occupy possess and enjoy the above mentioned tract of Land without any manner of Trouble Hindrance Interruption Molestation or denial of him the said George Flanagan his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns except about 15 acres supposed in Trees Lines that from him and his Heirs and no further and the Remainder of so that the said Flanagan will warrant and forever defend from the just & Lawfull Claim of any person or persons what so ever in witness whereof the said Flanagan hath hereunto set his hand and affixed this seal this day and date first above written Sign<sup>d</sup> Seal<sup>d</sup> in presence of James Halks  mark George Flanagan  mark

362 The following Deed of Conveyance from John Williams to William Goddard Smith being proved before James Wilson Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath of William Pihgel was presented and recorded this 11<sup>th</sup> day of November 1799 This Indenture made this 28<sup>th</sup> day of November 1796 between John Williams of the State of S<sup>th</sup> Carolina & Pinckleton County of the one part & William Goddard Smith of Greenville County & State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Williams for and in consideration of the sum of one Hundred Pound Lawful Money to him in hand paid the Receipt whereof is here by acknowledged the said John Williams hath bargain and sold and by these presents doth bargain sell release & confirm unto the said William Goddard Smith all that Tract or Parcel of Land containing 39 2 acres Situate in the State aforesaid Greenville County on some branches of Derow Creek on the S<sup>th</sup> side of S<sup>th</sup> Creek Part of S<sup>th</sup> Creek Tract originally granted to James Hafford by Patent bearing date the 4<sup>th</sup> day of July 1791 also being a part of a Tract 703 originally granted to Nicholas White
