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The following Deed of Conveyance from William Pollard & Benjamin Pollard to William Cox being proven before Thomas Edwards Esq. by the oath of James Sanford was presented and Recorded this 1<sup>st</sup> June 1800 State of Carolina

Know all men by these presents that we William Pollard and Benjamin Pollard sent of the County of Greenville in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of one Hundred Pounds to us paid by William Cox sent of the County and State aforesaid have Granted Bargained sold and Released and by these Presents do Grant bargain sell and Release unto the said William Cox sent all that Plantation or tract of ~~one~~ Hundred and forty acres of Land (more or less) lying in Greenville County on the Ruddy fork of Ruddy River beginning on a sweet Gum which stands on the south side of the said Ruddy fork of Ruddy River and running westward thirty nine Chains to a pine Coffer from thence running south eastward to a Stake Corner five chains and a half from thence running to Pyles branch thence running up the said Pyles branch to a poplar stump within a few Rods of the said being a Pollards mill thence running along a conditional line

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to a Stake on John Brashers line to include ten acres of the said Benjamin Pollards sent Land thence running along the said John Brashers line to the said William Pollards line thence along the said Pollard and Brashers a cross the said Pyles branch to the said Ruddy fork to include one Hundred and thirty acres of William Pollards Land thence running up and bounding on the said Ruddy fork to the beginning to include one Hundred and forty acres more or less it being part of a tract of Land granted to Hance Black and part to Hanne Hutson and the tenans granted to John Pyles as by Reference to the Grant Book will more fully appear Together with all and singular the Rights members Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to Have and to Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said William Cox his Heirs and assigns forever and well hereby being our selves our Heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said one Hundred and forty acres of Land more or less with the premises unto the said William Cox sent his Heirs and assigns against our selves our Heirs and assigns and all and every other person or persons what soever In witness whereof we do here unto set our hands and seals this sixteenth day of May one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine
