


418 The following Dued of Conveyance from James Ashe To Jeremiah Niblett  
being proven before Thomas Edwards Esq<sup>r</sup> by the Oath of Elias Bark was  
presented and Recorded this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of June 1800 —  
State of Carolina Greenville County —  
Know all men by these presents that James Ashe of the  
City of Charleston of the one part, and in consideration of one hundred  
dollars have granted bargained & sold unto Jeremiah Niblett  
one tract of fifty acres of land lying in Greenville County on the  
Devil's Fork a branch of Saluda River Surveyed for John Petman  
June the 1<sup>st</sup> August 1785 by Joseph Whitney, and Granted to

419 James Ashe the Sixth Day of April 1799 by His Excellency  
Charles Pinckney Esq<sup>r</sup> Governor of this State his by reference said  
Grant will more fully appear together with all woods water courses  
profits commodities hereditaments and appertenances belonging or in  
any wise Incident or appertaining to the said premises above mentioned  
and all and every part thereof with all rents and profits there of and  
I bind myself my Heirs Executors Administrators or assigns to warran-  
tant and forever defend the above mentioned tract of fifty acres  
of Land to the said Jeremiah Niblett his Heirs Executors Adminis-  
trators and assigns the claim or claims of any any or every  
Person or Persons what so ever In witness whereof I have hereunto  
set my Hand and fixed my seal this 19<sup>th</sup> day of November 1799 and  
in the twenty fourth year of the Independence of the United States  
of America

I know all men by these presents that I Samuel James Atston of  
Greenville District in the State aforesaid in Consideration of Three Hun-  
dred Dollars to me paid by Franky Wickliff of the District and State  
aforesaid have granted bargained, sold, and released and by these presents  
do grant bargain sell and Release unto the said Franky Wickliff  
two Lots of the Village of Pleasantburg at Greenville Court House  
and numbered in the Chart of said village No 11 & 15 Contiguous  
to and adjoining the lot whereon the said Franky Wickliff now  
lives and runs as follows viz, Beginning on a Stake near the s<sup>d</sup>  
Franky Wickliff's House and running thence E<sup>ng</sup> 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> W 23<sup>5</sup>/6 feet to  
a Stake S<sup>s</sup>, thence S<sup>o</sup> 15<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> W 110 feet to a Stake S<sup>s</sup>, thence S<sup>o</sup> 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> E<sup>ng</sup>  
23<sup>5</sup>/6 feet to a Stake S<sup>s</sup>, thence N<sup>o</sup> 15<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> E<sup>ng</sup> 110 feet to the beginning
