

424 The following Deed of Conveyance from Merrick Herrington to John Whilton being proven before William Cowen Esq; by the Oath of Mr. Easley was presented and Recorded this 11<sup>th</sup> day of June 1800

State of S<sup>t</sup> Carolina. I know all men by these presents that Merrick Herrington of Greenville County and state of S<sup>t</sup> Carolina in consideration of the sum of One Hundred and Seventy Pounds to me paid by John Whilton of the County aforesaid have Granted Bargained Sold and Released and by these presents do Grant & Bargain sell and Release unto the said John Whilton a Plantation or tract of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid on both sides of South Pacotah River Beginning at a white oak (being an agree corner on a line of the Land Granted to Samuel Easley by patent bearing Date the 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1783) & he by Deed of Conveyance made to Ann Cowen for a part of said tract Granted to Samuel Easley by the above recited Patent and he the said Cowen to by Dadey Conveyance to William Easley and he the said William Easley by Deed of Conveyance to me Reference to the same being had well made this little more clearly appear & running thence S<sup>o</sup> 47<sup>f</sup> 6<sup>s</sup> 11<sup>t</sup> 6<sup>ft</sup> to a Red Oak near a branch thence N<sup>o</sup> 43<sup>f</sup> 38<sup>s</sup> Ch<sup>m</sup> 72<sup>t</sup> L<sup>ft</sup> to a Chestnut thence N<sup>o</sup> 47<sup>f</sup> W<sup>o</sup> 60<sup>s</sup> Ch<sup>m</sup> Cropping the River to a Black Jack thence by an agreed line Cropping the River about Two Rod below the Mouth of Greens Creek to the beginning containing by Estimation Two Hundred acres <sup>be the same</sup> more or less also one other tract or parcel of Land joining the above lands beginning at a white oak the beginning corner of the above tract and running thence S<sup>o</sup> 55<sup>f</sup> W<sup>o</sup> 12<sup>s</sup> Ch<sup>m</sup> to a black oak thence S<sup>o</sup> 1<sup>f</sup> 6<sup>s</sup> 33<sup>t</sup> Ch<sup>m</sup> 80<sup>t</sup> L<sup>ft</sup> to a Cherry thence N<sup>o</sup> 75<sup>f</sup> E<sup>o</sup> 36<sup>s</sup> Ch<sup>m</sup> to a Post oak thence S<sup>o</sup> 30<sup>f</sup> E<sup>o</sup> 11<sup>s</sup> Ch<sup>m</sup> 30<sup>t</sup> L<sup>ft</sup> to a Red Oak near a branch thence down the several Meanders of the branch to Red the second corner of the above tract the 1<sup>st</sup> branch being an agreed line thence S<sup>o</sup> 47<sup>f</sup> W<sup>o</sup> to beginning containing by Estimation One hundred acres in the same more or less the same being the
