State of S Carolina—Know all men by these presents that I Nathaniel Gentry of Greenville County in Consideration of the sum of two Hundred and Thirty Dollars to me paid by Jeremiah Brown of the County aforesaid have Granted bargained sold and Released and and by these presents do Grant bargain sell and release unto the said Jeremiah Brown a plantation or tract of Land lying and

1129 being in the County aforesaid on both sides of S^r Pacolet River beginning at a Red Oak in the fork of the Gruns Creek and the river about one chain from the river Willey S Browns corner running there S^E 30° W crossing the river to a Post Oak then to a Pine on David Halls land there A 10 A 16 Ch^s 50 L^t to a pine there N 60° W 7 Ch^s to a chestnut oak there A 10 A 19 Ch^s crossing the river to a red oak there N 60° E to Willey S Browns line to a Stake there S^E 30° E to a red oak there S^E 2 Ch^s 15 L^t to a black oak there S^E 30° E to the beginning containing by estimation One hundred acres the same manor left being part of a tract granted by Patent to Joseph Abewell bearing date 5th day of December 1791 and by him conveyed to John Huddleston and by him conveyed to William Laughlin Sen^r Huddleston his son and by them conveyed to Asaham Burke^r by him conveyed to Ruellin Barretto and by him to me whom on is erected a mill together with all and singular the rights numbers hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the said Jeremiah Brown his heirs and assigns forever and so hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Jeremiah Brown his heirs and assigns against my self and my heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof
