Know all men by these presents that Lipe Holland of Greenville
County and the State aforesaid planter in consideration of Two hundred
Dollars to me paid by Samuel Mosley of the County and State aforesaid
said planter have granted bargained sold delivered and by these presents
do grant bargain sell and Release unto the said Samuel Mosley all that
tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the County and
State aforesaid on Saluda River Consisting of three Hundred and ten
acres be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit by the
Lands of Thomas Jones Joseph Wood John Jones and Mary Dowell's lines
to her Spring branch thence down the Spring branch to the Mill Creek
thence down the said Mill Creek bounding on the line of Daniel
McKinney to the mouth there of thence down the lines various meanders
of the River to Thomas Jones corner it being the beginning corner
the same being that tract of Land whereon Lipe Holland now lives
and Conveyed to him by Charles Booker by a Deed of Conveyance bearing
Date the 28th Day of June 1794 Together with all and singular the
rights members hereditaments and appartenances to the said premises
belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining I do have and

being proven before H Cobb Esq^r by the oath of James McCarley was presented
and Recorded this 24th day of July 1800

This Indenture made this Thirtieth day of September in the year of
our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety five Between James
Moor of the South Territory of the one part and James Thompson of
the County of Greenville in the state of Carolina of the other part witnesseth
that the said James Moor for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred
Silver Dollars to him in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of
these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and he the said
James Moor hath granted Bargain^d and sold All^d Feas^d and Confirm^d
and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien free of Release &
Conform unto the said James Thompson his heirs and assigns one certain
Tract or Parcel of Land situate lying and being in Washington
District and Greenville County at N.B. six of Saluda River containing
Two hundred and nine acres it being a tract of Two hundred and
nine acres granted to James Moor by his Excellency Thomas Pinckey
Esq^r Governor of the aforesaid State Granted and dated the third day
of September one thousand seven hundred and Eighty seven Beginning
at a poplar on the bank of Saluda three Rounding at E eighty Chains
and thirty five links to a post Oak in James McCarley's line thence along
E line to a post Oak corner thence South ten Degrees East Twenty five
Chains to a Black Oak corner thence South thirty five Degrees west thence
four Chains and fifty links to a post oak corner thence S.E. Seven Chain &
fifty Links to a post oak corner thence at five chains to a stake thence
South East Nineteen Chains and fifty Links to a post oak corner thence
sixteen Chains to a stake thence South East nineteen Chains and fifty Links
to a Hickory on Saluda bank and thence up said River to the first station
there together with all houses gardens orchards &c pines Bucklings wood
