

The following Deed of Conveyance from Robert Crenshaw to John Jones being proven before John Burns Esq. by the oath of Pleasant Eastley was presented and Read this 10<sup>th</sup> day of Feb<sup>y</sup> 1801 -

State of Carolina - Know all men by these presents that I Rob<sup>t</sup> Crenshaw of Greenville County in the state aforesaid am held and firmly bound unto John Jones of said state and County aforesaid in the Consideration of the sum of thirty five pounds Sterling money to me paid by the said John Jones and the sd Robert Crenshaw have granted Bargained sold and Released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and released unto the said John Jones all that tract of Land containing one hundred and Fifty acres more or less situate lying and being on the title House branch of Rudy river on south side of Brush Creek in Greenville County and state aforesaid Bounds N<sup>W</sup> by Prys land to a red oak from thence E by vacant land to a red oak from thence S<sup>W</sup> to red from thence E to a red oak station on Turpens line from thence to Srogins line and from thence to Hugh Sparks line & a long said line to the red oak corner from thence to the beginning Together with all and singular the rights Accoutrements & appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise Incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said John Jones his Heirs and assigns forever and I as here by binding myself my Heirs Ex<sup>ts</sup> and adm<sup>rs</sup> to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John Jones his Heirs
