The following deed of conveyance from William Blythe to Wm Roundtree being proven before Daniel Wright Esq. by the oath of Isaac Gray was presented and recorded this 18<sup>th</sup> day of June 1801

Know all men by these presents that William Blythe of the State of South Carolina Greenville District hath bargained sold by these presents doth bargain sell and release to Wm Roundtree a certain plantation or tract of land containing fifty acres situated in Greenville District on bushy creek a branch of Rudy River its being part of a tract of land originally granted to Jeremiah Chandler by his Excellency William Moultrie Esq. Governor over the State beginning at a stake thence along John Goodwyns line & corner to a black oak thence down towards the lower line to a black oak corner from thence to a black oak then up the old line to the beginning containing fifty acres more or less the said land that the said Blythe now lives on

At the said Wm Blythe doth warrant and forever defend the said land from me my self my heirs executors administrators or assigns to the said Wm Roundtree his heirs & all that tract of land containing fifty acres more or less full and clear from me my self my heirs & every other person or persons whatsoever and for the sum of twenty three dollars & a quarter to me in hand paid by the said Wm Roundtree I have bargained sold the above fifty acres of land the me is here by acknowledged ~~and~~ In Witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this second day of February one thousand eight hundred and one
