

237 The following deed of Conveyance from Roland Tankersly to James Harrison being proven before Hudson Bay Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath of James Harrison Jun<sup>r</sup>, was presented and recorded this 11<sup>th</sup> July 1801 -

State of Carolina - Know all men by these presents that Roland Tankersly of Greenville County and State aforesaid for and in consideration of five hundred dollars to me paid by James Harrison of do County and State have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said James Harrison all that part of a certain tract of land lying and being in the County of Greenville and on the grove Creek originally granted to John Ham for 3500 acres and sign<sup>d</sup> by Governor Gaurard on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of January One thousand seven hundred and eighty five all that part of said tract beginning on a stake the Original corner thence west fifty Chain to a red Oak the Original corner thence North on the Original line to a Stake James Pynes corner thence on Pynes line to a stone corner on the Original line thence South on the Original line to the beginning containing Two hundred and forty acres more or less bounded by Henry Mchans land on the South by Capt Bensons land on the west by James Pynes land on the North on the North the East by Unknown lands

Together with all and singular the rights members Perquisites and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any ways incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said James Harrison his Heirs and assigns forever and Also hereby bind my self my heirs and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said James Harrison his Heirs and assigns against my self and my heirs and
