Sutton being proven before Reubin Barnett Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath  
of Archibald Dill was presented and recorded this 2<sup>d</sup> July 1801

I Robin Sutton of Greenville District in consideration  
of the sum of three hundred dollars to me paid by John  
Sutton of said state and District I have granted bar-  
gained and sold and released & by these presents do grant  
bargain sell and release unto the said John Sutton  
a plantation or tract of land lying and being in  
Greenville District and state aforesaid on a branch of  
the sink hole fork of tiger river being a part of eight  
hundred and seventy two acres of land in one tract  
granted to Austin Clayton by a patent bearing date the 1<sup>st</sup>
