I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & adm^{rs} to warrant & for ever defend all & singular the s^d premises unto the s^d William Sutherns his heirs & assigns against myself & my heirs & assigns & against every other Person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. witness my hand & seal the fifth day of February in the year of our Lord 1801 & in the twenty fifth year of the Independence of the United States of America -

Planter, in Consideration of eighty dollars to me paid in hand by Job Hinson of the District and State afores^d farmer, have bargained sold and released & by these presents do bargain sell & release unto the s^d Job Hinson all that tract of Land containing sixty five acres more or less above the Indian boundary line on the middle fork of Tyger River, originally granted to James Irwin Esq. and by him
